Andrews has elephantiasis



A condition in which a limb or other part of the body becomes grossly enlarged due to obstruction of the lymphatic vessels, typically by the nematode parasites which cause filariasis.

Andrews story

 Mr Andrews is a y/o male who presented with leg pain, enlargement and oozing. Pt's foot is grossly enlarged possible tumor. Pt stated "I have elephantiasis" he stated that he was told by a traditional healer that he was bewitched for dating another man's wife. For that reason, he really never seek for medical care because it's spiritual. Andrews is married to 3 wives with over 20 children but unable to work and fe<mark>ed his</mark> family. The tumor has caused Mr. Andrews to have to deal with the community rejection, pain and low self esteem.

Accomplishments

- Consulted and treated 49 patients
- Treated 18 children
- Initiated IVF= as patients presented with dehydration

Precious stated she wants to be a doctor in the future but she isn't attending school because parents can not afford \$160 each year for her education

- David is a 7 year old boy who was found by caring hands in 2017 with severe malnourishments, persistent diarrhea, cough, thrush and failure to thrive
- David was sent to the hospital in 2017 and was diagnosed with HIV
- Caring Hands established a care plan and in collaboration with BINGO hospital in Mutengene to follow the child.
- David was placed on antivirals and other meds

- During this mission, the team was excited to surprise David but on arrival, David's circumstance had taken another turn. David was worse as he had relapse for failure to comply with care plan. The parents stopped caring for David medically, the boy ran out of medications, did not go for his 6month checkup as scheduled.
- As it relates to the civil crises in the Country, Caring Hand volunteer who was following David care was displaced and the responsibility defaulted to the parents.
- Parents stated they had no means of transportation to take him to the hospital or to go pick up his antivirals.

Meet Daniel

• He is 3 month old baby boy born with an imperforate anus - a birth defect that happens while the baby is still growing in the womb. This defect means that the baby has an improperly developed **anus**, and therefore can't pass stool normally from their **rectum** out of their body. Many times babies with this condition also have other defects of the **rectum**.

Care Plan

- Baby Daniel has 2 failed surgeries to established a colostomy and was septic when we got there. Baby was treated with antibiotics and basic supplies such as pampers and colostomy bags provided. A bag cost 14 dollars in Cameroon and this single mom has no job and is struggling to care for Daniel.
- In 3 months Daniel will need surgery to correct his condition, Caring Hands Africa is seeking for funding to pay for his surgery.

3 yr old little girl with Rickets



- Genu valgum, commonly called "knock-knee", is a condition in which the knees angle in and touch each other when the legs are straightened. Individuals with severe valgus deformities are typically unable to touch their feet together while simultaneously straightening the legs.
- Treatment consists of vitamins
- Treatment may involve adding vitamin D or calcium to the diet, medications, or possibly surgery.
